Summer of Reining

The NRHA (National Reining Horse Association) serves as the standard setting body for the sport of Reining worldwide. Its mission is to promote the sport, while celebrating and advancing the finest traditions of western horsemanship.





From 3 - 8 July, the World Reining Championships will take place for the first time ever, following the format held in the past at the World **Equestrian Games.**

There will be animal welfare and medication rules in place to ensure clean sport and the best environment for the horses.

The 20 best riders of those team contests will qualify for the individual finals. Winners in all categories will be crowned "World Reining" Champions.

NRHA European Affiliate Championships NRHA Ancillary Show Swiss Reining Challenge


> The European Affiliate Championships are competitions amongst all the European Members of the NRHA and are held to find the European Champions.

The Sport

The equestrian sport itself is divided into western riding and classical riding.

Reining... is one of nine disciplines of western riding, considered by some as the "dressage" of the western riding world. It originates from the working movements of horses and riders when herding cattle.

Reining is designed to show the athletic ability of ranch-type horses in the confines of a show arena. Contestants are required to run one of 10 approved patterns, divided into seven or eight manoeuvres, including small slow circles, large fast circles, flying lead changes, 360 degree spins and what is generally considered the signature move of the reining horse, ...

... the sliding stop.

Reining is getting more popul around the world. Despite the seemingly relaxed attitude of both horse and rider and the loose reins typically used, Reining demands high levels of concentration and riding skills with smoothness, finesse, attitude, quickness and authority all being closely watched.



Spectators will notice low headed horses. This, however, is not a sign of exhaustion but of relaxation.



The Score

Scoring... will be on a basis of 0-Infinity, with 70 denoting an average performance. There will be five judges scoring each ride, with the top and bottom scores dropped to give an average final score. In the event of a tie, the scores from all five judges

The judge can either add or deduct up to 1 and 1/2 points on each manoeuvre in half-point increments based on the 'quality' of the manoeuvre. Penalties are also allocated for minor deviations from the pattern; major deviations result in a zero score for the go.

are added for the three counting

Team Members.

In scoring, credit is given for smoothness, finesse, attitude, quickness and authority when performing the various manoeuvres. Controlled speed in the pattern raises the level of difficulty and makes the Reining horse more exciting and pleasing to watch.

Increased level of difficulty is rewarded with higher scores if the manoeuvres are performed correctly.

Riders will receive a score of zero if:

- use of more than index or first finger between reins
- failure to complete pattern as written
- performing the maneuvers other than in specified order
- backing more than two strides
- ·a turn of more than 90 degrees.

A judge is required to penalize a horse 1/2 of a point for a delayed change of lead by one stride, where the lead change is required by the pattern description and deduct 1 point for over or under spinning up to 1/4 of a turn.







Manoeuvres

Circles

The horse must perform large, fast circles at a near-gallop and smaller, slow circles at a lope.

Lead Change

The horse changes its leading front and hind legs at the lope mid-stride, during the suspension phase of the gait.

Rundown

A gallop or "run" along the long side of the arena, A rundown is a required movement prior to a sliding stop and a rollback to the designated direction.

Sliding Stop

To finish a rundwown the horse suddenly comes to a complete halt, planting its hind feet in the footing and allowing its hind feet to slide several feet, while continuing to let its front feet "walk" forward. The movement should finish in a straight line, and the horse's position should not change.



Backup

Quick back up strides for at least 10 feet (3 m). The horse must back in a perfectly straight line, stop and hesitate a moment before the next movement.

Rollback

The horse performs a 180-degree turn after halting from a sliding stop, and immediately goes forward again into a lope.

Spins or Turnarounds

Beginning from a standstill, the horse spins 360 degrees or more (up to four and one-quarter full turns) in place around its stationary inside hind leg.

Pause or Hesitate

Stand still for a few seconds to "settle" between certain movements in the reining pattern, particularly after spins.













The Location

The **CS Ranch** is the biggest and most modern private reining facility in Switzerland, ideally situated and equipped for professional reining lessons.

It houses more than 40 boxes for horses and is at the same time an ideal location for international Reining tournaments. The roofed horseriding arena measures 95 by 50 meters and can accommodate more than 1400 guests.

Owner Corinna Schumacher, with a lot of attention to detail, is constantly striving for the **CS Ranch** to remain the best environment for reining horses.

Since 2006, **CS Ranch** has made its mark for hosting professional reining shows such as Swiss Slide and from 2009 the famous **SVAG CS Classic**.

Showmanager Eric Obrecht and his ambitious team from CS Ranch are always making a big effort to impress riders, officials and spectators with our SVAC CS Classic.
